Alton Carter, author of *The Boy Who Carried Bricks*, will be the October 14 Academy of Senior Professionals luncheon speaker.

Carter came from a broken home and was put in foster care. Research indicates that most children in that kind of home will live a portion of their lives in prison. Rarely will such a young person find a path to escape without the aid of people who not only care but will persevere as that young person continually tries to push them away through bad attitudes and behavior. Carter did buck the trend. A former police officer, he was the first person in his family to graduate from high school and college.

After receiving his bachelor's degree at Oklahoma State University, Carter went on to write *The Boy Who Carried Bricks* and *Aging Out*, (regarding growing up in foster care), as well as two children's books: *The Boy Who Dreamed Big* and *The Boy Who Went to the Library*. He now uses his story to encourage adults and young people as director of youth ministries for the First United Methodist Church of Stillwater, OK.

In 2015, Carter founded the Alton Carter Inspire Foundation with the goal of assisting

young people who have lived in foster care, group homes, or DHS juvenile facilities to earn a college degree.

Soon after getting a bachelor's degree in mass communications and journalism, Scott Secor became the SNU Sports Information Director. For the next dozen years, his focus was publicizing the exploits of SNU students in intercollegiate sporting events.



Then, in 2010, Scott Secor added classroom teaching to his work as a sports publicist by teaching some speech courses. That shift in focus led to the completion of an MS in Counseling Psychology in 2012. By 2014 he was a Licensed Professional Counselor in Oklahoma.

He entered a doctoral program in psychology at the University of Oklahoma while beginning to teach classes for SNU's Department of Psychology and Counseling. In 2018, he was awarded a Ph.D. in psychology by OU. His dissertation for that degree was titled: *Relationships among Sexual Assault, PTSD Subclusters and the Sexual Assault Reporting Process, and their Impact on Characterological Self-Blame.*

In 2016 Scott Secor was named Director of Clinical Training for SNU's graduate programs in counseling. In that position, he oversees 70-80 student internship opportunities per year involving approximately 15 different facilities. Recently, he negotiated an agreement with the state's largest children's hospital to secure five to seven grant-funded paid internships for SNU's master's in counseling students.



Goodbye My Darling, Hello My Dear is Dale's chronicle of his and Em-malyn's entry into parenthood. Sometimes funny, sometimes heart-breaking, this recently published book allows the reader access into the German's desire to share their love with a child and how that child became part of their

family. Dale wrote the volume using his own journals in which he has written a daily entry since he first dreamed of becoming a parent.

In November, we will turn to a fictional volume. John Dwyer teaches history and ethics at SNU. He has also written attention-keeping tomes about the Civil War, a western, and Oklahoma. *When the Bluebonnets Come* is the fictional story of Katie Shahanan, a preacher's kid growing up in Texas. However, a major trauma disrupts the calm sweet life she has known.
