LADY CRUSADERS TAKE IT TO THE NEXT LEVEL

Eastern Nazarene College's Lady Crusaders shocked everyone by finishing their season with a records of 26 wins and 3 losses and a trip to the Sweet Sixteen NCAA tournament. Although they had a roster of only 10 girls, the ten gave their all and sparked school spirit that had been hidden for years. The Quincy community rallied around the girls and a spirit of excitement filled the campus. As the season ended a satisfied Coach Stutzman said their goal was "to advance as far as we could, and not to lose to a team poorer than ourselves. I think we did that." The events that led up to their trip to New Jersey began with their CCC Championship victory over Colby-Sawyer which earned them a place in the NCAA playoffs. After drawing a first-round bye, the Crusaders earned another victory over Richard Stockton

University. Down to 16 teams, ENC faced Rowen in New Jersey. Despite having more fans at the game than Rowan or any of the other three schools in the Northwest Atlantic Sectional, the girls were defeated. The team is already looking ahead to next year. Coach Stutzman commented, "We have most of our top scorers back, Kristy Smith was our leading scorer, Jody Gardner was out 2nd leading scorer, and she'd led us scoring the last two years. Nicole Braddock was 3rd for most of the season in scoring." One this is for certain the talents and spirit of senior Toni Kabilian, Naomi Jacobs, Young Cobb, and Melissa Christmas will be greatly missed. Jody Gardner summed it up the best, "I think we'll be fine, I think we'll do well again next year. I know I'll be back, ready to go."



Highlights of the Season



Melissa Christmas - Most Valuable Player
Melissa averaged 10.6 points, 9.7 rebounds, 2.6 assists, and 3.3 steals each game. She ended the season shooting 48.1% (104-216) from the floor. She had a season high of 18 points and 15 rebounds in a win against Endicott. As of February 25 she was ranked 4th in the conference in rebounds and steals.



Kristy Smith - Rookie of the Year
Kristy averaged 15.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.8 assists, and 3.2 steals a game. She ended the season with a 40.2% (70-174) three-point field goal percentage and shot 41% from the floor. She had a season/career high of 28 points in a win against Emerson. As of February 25 she was ranked 9th in the conference for scoring, 1st in three-point field goal percentage, and 9th in the country in three-point field goals made.



The team captain, Jody Gardner, earned a spot on the 1st team All-Conference and was the top free throw shooter in the conference at 86%. The junior guard also ranked 4th in assists at 3.83 per game and 5th in 3-point field percentage at 34%. Gardner was named ENC athlete of the month in January for leading the team to a perfect 8-0 records while averaging 15.9 points per game.



James Stutzman - Coach of the Year
Coach Stutzman led ENC in compiling a 22-2 overall record and a 11-1 conference record along with the regular season championship. He took ENC further than any sports team has ever gone in ENC history. With his determination and incredible coaching abilities he surprised even dedicated Crusader fans.





True Faith: Grace in Action

The year was 1941. Two 15-year old boys were out for a joyride in a shiny new, black Pontiac. It was a dirt road shaking its way north from Portland, Maine heading towards Princess Point on the road to Yarmouth. One of the boys lost control on a turn, and they plummeted towards the ocean below, saved only by hitting a tree on the way down the embankment.

The car was totaled, and the boys bruised and bloodied. And now it came time to face the father who owned what was left of the new car his only means of transportation. Bruce Whitney shouldn't have been driving. He didn't have a license, and Austin Harris should never have allowed his friend to drive his father's car. But it was too late for regrets now. It was time to face the music, or more likely the firing squad.

Elery Harris quickly surmised that his son's friend Bruce had been driving, but contrary to all expectations, responded in a way which made no sense at all. He looked at the distraught and frightened teenager and quietly said: son just forget this ever happened. Stunned, the boy broke into sobs and pleaded: Is there anything I can do for you? The father responded: Do you mean it? I'll do anything for you, Mr. Harris! Would you go to church with us, Bruce?

Now Bruce was anything but a churchgoer, but he gladly consented. Within weeks, Bruce became a Christian. A few years later he matriculated to ENC, partially because Elery (a longtime ENC Trustee and close friend of President Ed Mann) had encouraged him to do so for years. In 2001, Bruce will celebrate with his class their fiftieth anniversary since graduating from ENC.

All these years later, Bruce still considers that strange event with that 1941, black Pontiac to be the watershed event of his life. Why? Because his Christian faith, his attending ENC, and his purposeful life since, filled with dedication to Church and family, all flowed from his direct encounter with what Christians call grace unmerited forgiveness and love.

And what does all this have to do with ENC graduates over a have a century later? A great deal. Many of you have had the opportunity to attend ENC or to be touched during your time at ENC by an act of kindness, forgiveness, or insight by grace and your life has never been the same. Sometimes the grace seemed to come directly from God, but at other times, and perhaps usually, grace came to you through other people your parents, your professors, a chapel speaker, a friend. And your lives have been changed, and you will never quite be the same again. For that is how grace works in our lives. It leaves us changed forever.

By the way a number of you have received financial support to complete your college education from the Elery Harris Endowed Scholarship, which Bruce Whitney and family friends helped start and fund many years ago. That's the way grace works. Given and properly received, the work of grace never ends with the recipient. It flows ever on like the eternal love of God so beautifully and perfectly made manifest in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ of Nazareth.

The theme of this year's Nautilus is true faith. I want to suggest to you that true faith is not so much right doctrine, as important as that is, but grace in action. Most of us are reached for the Kingdom not by words of truth, but by acts of love.

My challenge to each of you as you go out from Eastern Nazarene College is that you be open for ways to pass on to those around you the grace and love of God which you have experienced in your own lives. For it will be through the prism of your lives, though the forgiveness, love, and kindness which you share with others, that God's grace will reach down to heal and transform a broken world.

May God richly bless each of you graduates the centennial class of Eastern Nazarene College!

His integrity and his commitment to the liberal arts and the importance of classroom teaching have been constant themes during his administration. He has not only talked about the integration of faith and learning, he has modeled it. One of his most important contributions to the College has been his important role in retaining tenure, but doing so in a way which includes post-tenure accountability. The percentage of our faculty with earned doctorates has risen during Dean Kale's administration, and faculty development has been strengthened. Dean Kale always put a high priority on recruiting faculty who were both spiritually committed and professionally qualified. The quality of new faculty which have come to the College during his time as Dean is impressive - a contribution which will serve Eastern Nazarene College well for decades to come. Dr. Kale intends to return to teaching in the communication discipline. We certainly wish David and Ruth the very best as they move on to this important next chapter in their lives.

In Carlo Gozzi's *The King Stag*, the two are cleverly combined with seemingly effortless ease, without losing the overall theme of the play. The theme reveals how man has been placed above all the other creatures of the earth, and elevated to the prestigious position of being made in the image of God. With that in mind, this play calls us to live up to this distinguished privilege. Our fondest hope is that we will all recognize Carlo Gozzi's message about the power of unconditional love, and we can collectively take a look into our lives and reassess our responsibility to reflect our Maker in the quality of our humanity.


Bright spots in the season were the wins over Fitchberg State College, Curry College, St. Joseph's of Maine, Anna Maria, and Mass Maritime.
